- Staged roll-out

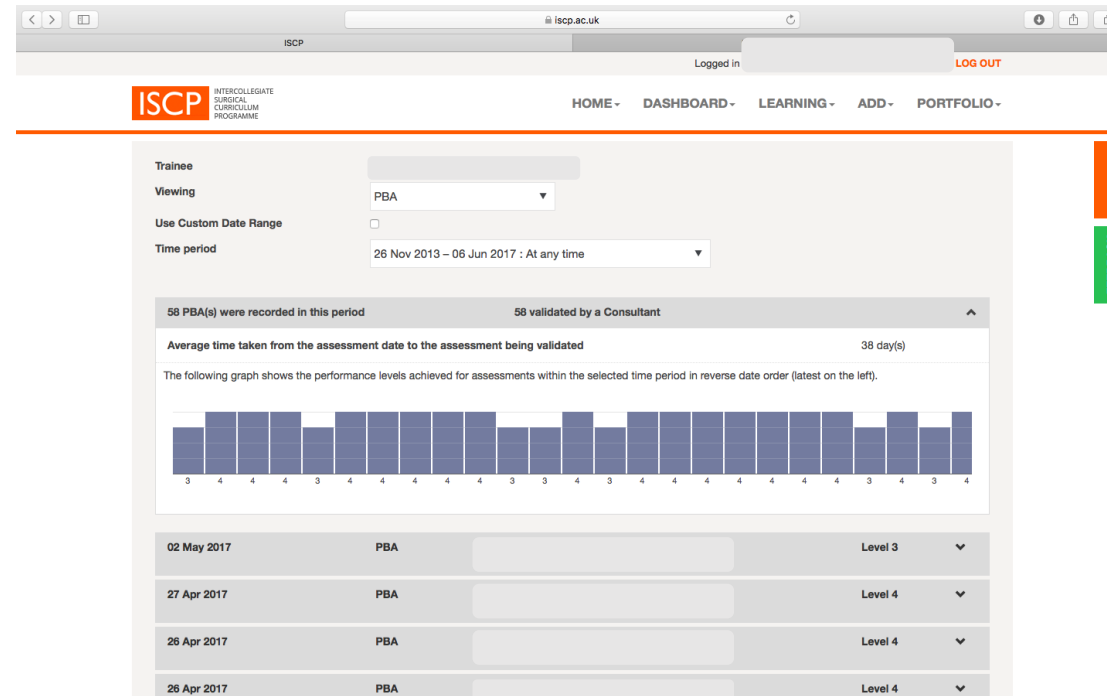


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METHODOLOGY: Online survey of surgical trainees

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Conclusion

1. Transition to new training assessment methods require buy-in from both the Trainer and Trainee to maximize success
2. Clear communication, guidance and prior training is crucial to avoid many issues outlined in our findings.
